The Student House (Reformierte StudentInnenhaus Moussonstr. 17) is <u>located</u> where Zürich's central university quarter meets a residential area of traditional villas in the Fluntern neighbourhood. In a historical building, it hosts an international, coeducational community of 18 students pursuing their BSc or MSc degrees.

The cost of accommodation:

Rent fee / person / month: CHF 390 to CHF 445.- (twin rooms - altogether 6 vacancies from Sept.) and CHF 480 to CHF 680.- (single rooms - altogether 2, perhaps 3 vacancies). It includes the cost of utilities, the cleaning of the corridors and batrhooms, and expenses of the weekly community dinners (on Wednesdays) during the semester. Deposit: CHF 400.-
